Salmon River Inspection: We received the FY22 Inspection of Completed Works for Flood Risk Management Project at Salmon River from Army Corps of Engineers.

Tour of Bare Hill Correction Facility: Supervisor Stewart took a tour of the Bare Hill Correctional Facility. She found it very informative and learned a lot about the programs and educational services available. She was very impressed and noted the staff being very knowledgeable and proud of the work that they do. Councilor Johnston also spoke to the amount of food donations the prisons make to the JCEO / Food Pantry programs.

BOARD MEMBER / COMMITTEE ITEMS:

Councilor Walbridge updated the board on the contract meeting him and Councilor Johnston had with Malone Minor Hockey. In attendance from the Village was Norm Bonner and Matt Boyea, from the Rec Park Commission was Carol Lashomb and Wayne Walbridge and from Malone Minor Hockey, Jason LaFlesh, Ryan O'Connor and Chuck McKee. They discussed items that we are still waiting on, we should be receiving a 990 on July 15th from Eleanor Pulsifer and MMH is reaching out to a CPA firm to do the 2020-2021 audit. Councilor Walbridge feels they have a good contract and suggests a 3 year agreement with an annual review. *Councilor Johnston* noted the financial representative is looking to be more transparent and give comprehensive information in their reports. The compressors at the rink are being moved before the next season begins, which should solve the issues that the neighbors had with noise.

SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS:

-All roads are open after the recent rainstorms. There was a lot of damage to our roads. The 4 culverts affected are back in place. Brown Road was the hardest hit, a half mile of that road was down to 3 feet wide, it all ended up in Webster Street Road. There were 8 houses that were not able to get through that road. The Village crew helped with the road repairs.

-The shoulders have been cut from Village line to the Low Road and on both sides of Webster Street.

-Superintendent Andrews has received a lot of positive feedback on the work that the Highway crew is doing.

Blacktop/Paving:

-Completed the Frenette Road Bellmont / Malone town line, a half mile, 2 lanes.

-Brick Church Road, a half mile of blacktop is complete. Brick Church Road is now blacktopped from the County Road to Teboville Road.

-Today worked on Teboville Road, one lane is complete and only about 400 ft. left go on other and that will be completed tomorrow (July 14, 2022).

-Webster Street Road will begin on Monday. Superintendent Andrews has been working with the Budget Officer keeping an eye on the numbers, there is enough money to put binder on that half mile.

-Wheeler Road, will begin July 25, 2022. This will be at the increased price.

-The Highway Committee met to discuss proceeds from the sale of surplus items.

There were 2 Loaders sold during the auction. Superintendent Andrews would like to purchase a new loader. He did some research and received five different bid prices. CAT came in with the lowest price. Payment was discussed and it will be paid outright from proceeds from the auction of surplus items.

The Board thanked all involved in the process that contributed to a successful auction of surplus goods that gives the opportunity to purchase new equipment.
